

“Designated Surveillance Area” is defined as an area enclosed by the following boundaries: starting at the intersection of the Idaho-Wyoming state line, the Teton County line and Yellowstone National Park boundary continuing east along the Teton County line to the Teton County/Park County line, following the Teton/Park County line Northward to the Montana State line, continuing east along the Montana State line/Park County line to Wyoming State Highway 120, following Wyoming State Highway 120 Southward to the Park County/Hot Springs County line, and continuing southwest to the junction of Park, Hot Springs, and Fremont Counties, continue to follow the Western Wind River Indian Reservation boundary south to the Sublette County line, following the Sublette County line south to the Sweetwater County line, following the Sublette/Sweetwater County line and the Sublette/Lincoln County line west to the Bridger-Teton National Forest Boundary, following the Bridger-Teton southern boundary west to the Idaho-Wyoming State line.
