Order No. 2011-02

This Order is issued on this 6th day of April, 2011 for the purpose of minimizing the risk of the spread of Brucellosis from infected wildlife to cattle outside of the Designated Surveillance Area by expanding the boundaries of the Designated Surveillance Area in two areas where elk Brucellosis seroprevalence is of concern and elk movement into areas previously not considered "at risk" is causing elk/cattle commingling and therefore increased Brucellosis exposure/transmission risks. It is hereby ordered that:

The boundaries of the Designated Surveillance Area are redefined to include as described: Beginning where the Wyoming-Montana state line intersects the Park and Big Horn County line, southerly along said county line to the Park and Washakie County line; south along said county line to the Washakie and Hot Springs County line; east then south along said county line to State Highway 431; west along said highway to State Highway 120; southeasterly along said highway to the Upper Cottonwood Creek Road (Hot Springs County Road 10); westerly then southerly along said road to the Owl Creek Road (Hot Springs County Road 1); southerly along said road to South Fork Owl Creek; westerly up said creek to the Northwest corner of the Wind River Indian Reservation boundary; southerly along the west boundary of said Reservation to the boundary between Fremont and Sublette Counties; southeasterly along said county line to the boundary between Sublette and Sweetwater Counties; west along said county line to the Sublette and Lincoln County line; west along said county line to U.S. Highway 189; southwestly along said highway to U.S. Highway 30; westerly along said highway to State Highway 89; west along said highway to the Wyoming state line; north along said state line to the boundary between Wyoming and Yellowstone National Park; east along the southern boundary of YNP to the southeast corner of YNP; following the YNP border north to the Montana/Wyoming line; east along said state line to the Park-Big Horn County line.

This order is an amendment to the requirements already found in the Chapter 2 Vaccination Against and Surveillance for Brucellosis rules in Section 3 (xvi) that adds a small portion of northwest Hot Springs County, the remainder of Park County east of State Highway 120, and a portion of Lincoln County south of the current DSA line.

These requirements are implemented to protect the health, viability, and marketability of the Wyoming cattle industry.

This Order is issued pursuant to Wyoming State Statute § 11-19-103. The State Veterinarian is directed to carry out this Order pursuant to § 11-19-101. This Order is effective April 30, 2011 and remains in effect until further notice.
