In addition to listed diseases, immediately report the following disease events:

#### Potential signs of foreign animal disease:

- High morbidity or mortality event
- Unexpected neurologic signs
- Vesicular lesions
- Blistering around an animal's mouth, nose, teats, or hooves
- Unusual ticks or maggots

#### Other signs to report:

- Disease in unusual species
- Disease in unusual geographic area
- Lack of response to usual treatment
- Abortion storm
- Suspicious necropsy findings
- Hemorrhagic septicemia
