

Wyoming's Vesicular Stomatitis Restrictions Effective July 8, 2019

1) A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required to be issued within 72 hours of livestock entry into Wyoming from any county where Vesicular Stomatitis (VSV) has been diagnosed within the past thirty (30) days.

2) Livestock including cattle, equine, swine, sheep, and goats, are prohibited entry into Wyoming if they have had known exposure to Vesicular Stomatitis within the past thirty (30) days or originate from a premises where Vesicular Stomatitis has been diagnosed within the past thirty (30) days or a premises under quarantine for VSV, or are showing clinical signs of VSV.

3) Livestock originating from a State or area where Vesicular Stomatitis has been diagnosed must have the following statement recorded on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection by the issuing accredited veterinarian:

"All animals identified on this certificate have been examined by me and found to be free from clinical signs of vesicular Stomatitis. These animals have not been located on a premises where Vesicular Stomatitis has been diagnosed within the past thirty (30) days."
